Oakcrest High School receives Title I funding as part of the No Child Left Behind grant that supports instruction for students who could benefit from supplemental assistance in language arts literacy and mathematics. The goal of the Title I program is to assist your child in developing and expanding language arts literacy and math skills taught in the classroom. In addition, this program aims to best prepare your child for the New Jersey High School Proficiency Assessment (HSPA), a mandatory standardized assessment given during the student's Junior year. This is a high-stakes assessment upon which students must demonstrate proficiency in both language arts literacy and mathematics in order to graduate high school.

Entrance and Exit Criteria**

All students are screened for Title I services using multiple quantitative and qualitative assessments. Additionally, parents/guardians may request Basic Skills assistance through the program as well. For students who transfer into the district with records that indicate participation in Basic Skills programs immediately prior to their transfer, the process for entrance into GEHRHSD Title I program may be modified or skipped.

An analysis of the data by the Title I administrative advisory group is used to make determinations of eligible students. Pupil needs shall be assessed by teaching staff members to determine pupil attainment of educational objectives. Procedures for such evaluation shall include, but not be limited to, teacher observation, parental/guardian interview, formal and informal classroom evaluation techniques, cumulative pupil records, and other student performance data collected through local benchmark assessments.

Additional information will be utilized as indicators relative to pupil attainment of educational objectives such as: teacher observation, formal and informal classroom evaluation techniques, cumulative pupil records, and other student performance data collected through local benchmark assessments. The district will monitor exited pupil data on a quarterly basis. Early signs of regression will be noted and preventive measures will be taken.
